Answering Service

The answering service continues to receive and return very few calls, the majority of which are to correct meeting information with a few people actually looking for information about OA in general and meeting dates and locations in particular. Though the call volume is low, the answering service is an important part of beginning a program of recovery for those who still suffer from compulsive overeating and NHI is committed to continuing this vital service.

Back in May a decision was made by the NHI Board to move to an internet based answering service vs. the carrier we had been utilizing, which will save our volunteers a lot of unnecessary effort, plus over \$500 a year in telephone service charges. We are fortunate to be able to take both our toll free and our local numbers with us to our new provider, so no brochure or website information will need to be changed.

Answering service volunteers agreed with the decision to find a cheaper and easier way to provide this service. Our new provider; eVoice will send messages directly to my email so that I can receive and distribute all messages vs. having volunteers commit so much time and effort every month for so few calls. Having messages sent directly to my email was not an option through our prior provider.
